

FLIP SHIFT SHOW SWITCH - TRANSITIONS IN SHOWING

Six part exhibition series, Stedefreund Berlin 10 December 2010 – 9 July 2011

The series FLIP SHIFT SHOW SWITCH consists of six exhibitions plus thematically linked events focusing on showing as the central concern of art and exhibition. It is particularly the moments of transition in showing that are of interest, in which showing is endowed with positional power, and the switch from showing to not showing goes hand in hand with the "politics of showing."

STEFKA AMMON // A K DOLVEN // EMANUEL GEISSER

exhibition April 1 – Mai 2, 2011 // Wed to Sat, 2 – 7 p.m. opening Friday, April 1, 2011, from 7 p.m.

"Seeing Is Remembering", curated by Anne Fäser, includes works by Norwegian artist A.K. Dolven, Swiss artist Emanuel Geisser and Stedefreund artist Stefka Ammon. As in a scientific experiment, they test the differentiation potential of memory in various configurations. Whereas Dolven's starting point is biographical, shaded with humor as well as nostalgia, the issue from Ammon's social perspective is the pitfalls of the precalibrated gaze, while Geisser's installations address the power of the blind spot to create and delimit space.

The exhibition will be open for Gallery Weekend Berlin, April 29 - May 1, 2011.
