Korridor refers to the architecture of the villa and its various conversions as the functions and role of the building changed over time. These include the squelched promise of an archway, walled, and the skylight, boarded-up, above it. Traces of dirt and dust on the walls and ceiling appeared to me as oversized black-and-white photos and served as a visual starting-point for the installation.

Collaboration Project Marlena Kudlicka / Anne Gathmann, Berlin 2007 This project is a response to The Institute in Glasspavilion concept UN INSTANT...PUIS LA NUIT. The materials are various layers of matte transparent glossy black. The Glasspavilion installation merges with the urban surrounding into one unit. As the viewer is not able to enter the work, it can only be seen from outside.

The pavilion intervention is an architectural animation of transparency and density that is based on the observation of a shadow prism. Through this analysis the applications address to open up a form/dimension that may appear and extend the pavilion structure when watching from specific angles. Like a three-dimensional painting or an urban diamond the space animates itself.




An animation, projected on a wall in daylight. The animation consists of linear drawings, which picture schematized objects. The individual scenes represent both the movement and the various stages of transformation of these objects towards abstraction. To emphasize the objects' relationship to space, I specifically chose objects that are clearly distinguishable and nameable and could be described as containers of space.

The animation explores the spatial condition of certain objects and above all their characteristics, which arise as a result of emblematic representation. Inherent aspects become perceptible, which were not independently visible before and which - contrary to the origin objects - are withdrawn from linguistic denotation. To that extent, this work deals with the connection of indications and form, exemplarily for the relationship between definition to reality.

Self-adhesive transparent shapes, whose forms resemble that of an outline of a box, drawn in a parallel perspective. Presented in piles, these elements can be adhered in combinations in which the implicit spatial structure becomes visible through the overlap of shapes. A part of each shape nevertheless remains strictly unstructured, in a two-dimensional realm.

This work concerns the process of distribution and arrangment as well as the inherent presence of existing order. The participation of the visitors is part of the installation.

Looking up to the window of the exhibition space from the street, a portion of the ceiling is framed by the window. From this vantage point, it is not possible to clearly identify what one sees - the paper strips attached to the ceiling appear to be three-dimensional forms.

The window, part of the façade of gallery Kule, is one of 24 windows. Every evening during the course of the exhibiton, one of each of these windows is opened.
